1 - PLEASE REGISTER 1ST: Sign in and get a bid number – you MUST use this number for any bids, beer or wine or cake purchase. Your contact information is for Auction purposes only.

2 - ENJOY THE AUCTION PARTY AND BID!

- **FOOD:** Please enjoy our complimentary appetizers.
- **DRINKS:** All non-alcoholic beverages are FREE. Beer/Wine are available for purchase (**per law, we cannot give out free alcohol**) – use your bid number or pay \$2 cash at the bar (we appreciate exact change).
- **SILENT AUCTION:** *Services and Gift Certificates* - Write your number and how much you wish to bid and check often as someone else might want the same item that you do! Please be aware of the bid increment listed on the bid sheet.
- **ARTISAN MARKET:** One of a kind, limited edition and handcrafted items! Some items have a fixed price because there is a limited amount of them – be the first one to sign up! There will also be items that follow the same guidelines as the Silent Auction – bid and keep checking.
- **PANTRY:** Hand made treats for any palate! Some items have a fixed price because there is a limited amount of them – be the first one to sign up! There will also be items that follow the same guidelines as the Silent Auction – bid and keep checking.
- **PARTIES:** 2018 Auction Party Sign-up – Need To Know

If you have attended our festivities before, here is what is staying **the same:**

- There are approximately 20 great parties available.
- Sign-ups will take place in two groups. Group 1 will open at 5:15 p.m.; Group 2 will open at 5:50p.m.
- At check-out, you will need to pay the set price per person for each party slot which you selected.
- At check-out you will get a reminder for each party which you selected.
- The party winners will be posted on a window on the parking lot side of the Parish Hall after each group of parties closes.

- Once the party winners have been posted on a Parish Hall window, if there are still any open slots, you can write your number on the paper to reserve a place with one slot representing one person.

If you have attended our festivities before, here is what is **different**:

- There are no tickets.
- There is no lottery.
- If you want to sign up for a party, you will need to stand in line. If you are not physically able to stand in line or **every** member of your bid number group is assigned to working elsewhere during the auction (i.e. kitchen crew) during the party sign up time, please email Shelly the prioritized list of the parties you want to attend by 5:00 p.m. Friday, November 2, and she will arrange to have a stand in sign up for you. Shelly_madsen@yahoo.com "Party assistants" may also be arranged after you register.
- Please prioritize IN ADVANCE which parties you want to attend; a planning sheet will be provided for you at the door if you request one.
- Sign-ups will take place in the nursery (the first door on your right after you enter the Parish Hall).
- Shortly before 5:15p.m., if you want to sign up for parties that are in Group 1, please gather by the nursery. We will draw a random bid number from a hat and the person with that bid number will go to the beginning of the line and be first through the door. Please line up in numerical order by bid number. For example, if #16 is pulled out of the hat, please line up 16, 17, 18, 19 etc. Repeat this step shortly before 5:50 for parties in Group 2.
- The line will start outside the nursery door in the parish hall and wrap around the outside of the nursery, going down the hall where the bathrooms are and down the long hallway to the left, if necessary. Please form a line along the wall opposite the bathrooms for the courtesy of our guests.
- When the door opens, one by one quickly enter the room and tell the party supervisor: what party you want to attend, your bid number and the number of spots you are purchasing. The party supervisor will write your number(s) down on the flip chart reserving your spot(s).
- Single people can sign up for a maximum of 2 slots per party. People from households of two or more people can sign up for party slots up to the number of people in their house. Examples:
 - Shelly and Greg are a family unit. They are bid #5. They have decided that Greg will stand in line to represent the family. Each time Greg goes through the line, he can sign up for a **maximum of two** slots for any one party.

- Greg enters the nursery from Parish Hall door and says “Meatball party, #5, 2 people.” He then exits the room through the hallway door and gets back in line so he can bid on an additional party.
- Kathy Hayne is single. She is bid #10. Each time she goes through the line, she can sign up for **one or two slots** for any one party
 - “Strawberry ice cream, #10, 1 person” (Kathy will attend the party as a single)
 - OR**
 - “Strawberry ice cream, #10, 2 people” (Kathy will bring a friend with her to the party)
- The Raygors are a **family of four** and are bid #20. Each time Rebecca goes through the line, she can sign up for a **maximum of four** slots for any one party
 - “French dinner, #20, 4 people”
- You can sign up for **only one party** each time you go through the line.
- If you want to attend more than one party, get in line again.
- When all the parties you want to attend are sold out, or there are no parties left which interest you, get out of line and enjoy the rest of the auction.
- Check the easel by the nursery entrance door to see which parties have been sold out.
- If you like, bring this paper with you to the auction. Use the worksheet below to prioritize the parties which you want. For additional information about specific parties, please see other pages in this catalogue.

- **ENTERTAINMENT:** When the Silent Auction ends at 6:30 p.m., please go to the sanctuary for a Sing-Along led by St. Alban’s inimitable Music Director, Veronica Tomanek. Sit down and relax for a few minutes while the Parish Hall gets reset for our last activity of the evening.
- **FANCY CAKES:** Be sure to “study” the Fancy Cakes in the Parish Hall sometime during the evening before the entertainment. Make a decision regarding what cake you would like to sample so that when you return to the Parish Hall after the Sing-Along, you will seat yourself at the table where the cake you have chosen is displayed (10 people per table maximum). At each table will be an envelope with cake purchasing slips. Each cake costs \$50 and it is up to the table to determine who will pay for the cake and how much. If there are 10 people and each one wants a slice, the cost would be \$5 per person so each person would take a slip, write his or her bid number on it along with the cost to be added to their final bill. If some generous individual wishes to purchase the cake for the ENTIRE table, that individual would take a slip, put his or her bid number on it and write \$50. PLEASE NOTE – **plates, forks, napkins and serving tool will not be provided unless there is a promise of \$50 in the envelope.....**
- **CHECK OUT: THERE WILL BE NO CHECK OUT BEFORE 7PM.** Check out starts shortly after the entertainment concludes. When you are ready, please proceed to the checkout lane. You will receive a folder that will have your bill for any purchases you have made. It will include party reminders if you qualify, gift certificates and other information that you may need on services that you have bought. It will include “tickets” to retrieve your items from the Artisan Market and the Pantry. Your teller will calculate your total amount and you can pay by cash or by check (no credit cards will be accepted). You will then go across the hall to pick up the items that you bought. **Thank you for your patience as you stand in line.** We will have 3 cashiers working to help you.
